Summer is a good time to take a drive through Ward 1. Signs of community growth and property improvements are abundant. There's a bonus to be had from the big selection of locally-produced fruit, vegetables, meats and baked goods available from on-farm markets and laneway stalls. And it's hard not to be impressed with the thousands of hectares of great looking crops under cultivation.

Across the southwestern corner of the township a number of new homes have been built and a surge in residential building within the Ariss's Ussher Creek development continues. Farm building projects coupled with a mix of industrial construction is also to be seen.

Road improvement is also a feature. Re-surfacing of Township Road 1, one of the township's most heavily travelled roads, running between Highway 124 and Paisley Road, is one of this year's major capital projects involving over two kilometers of work.

Canada 150 celebrations included the unveiling by the township of an exhibit at the Marden Community Centre commemorating one of the areas earliest structures. Using wood salvaged from the original McDonald farm structure, it's an impressive piece of historical work and certainly worth a visit.

I hope you had a great summer. Whether you're heading back to school in September, resuming your routine or beginning a new venture, may the year ahead be successful as you take one day at a time.

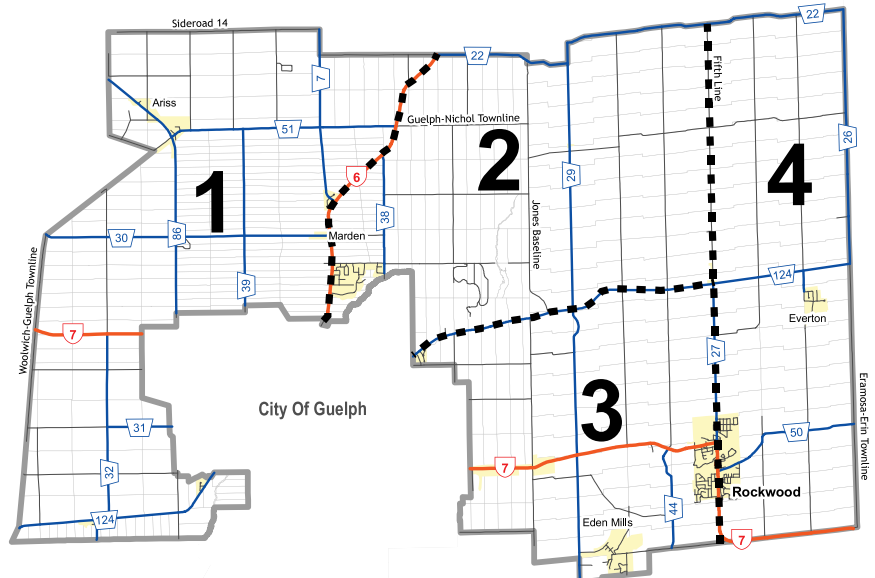

Ward Electoral Boundaries**

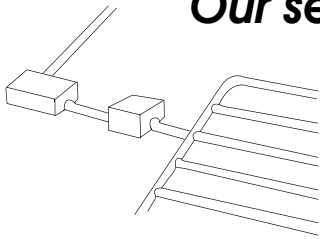

CIVIC NUMBER OR SIGN REQUEST

It is a requirement under Township of Guelph/Eramosa By-law 53/2011 that all residential, commercial, industrial, religious and educational properties, where an emergency may be reported, must be signed with a civic address identification plate (green sign). These signs must be obtained from the Municipal Office. Replacement identification plates can be purchased at a cost of \$35.00 each and, if required, replacement posts are available for \$15.00 each.

Properties that do not have an assigned civic number can obtain one by contacting the Roads Department at 519-856-9596 ext. 120 or email lvince@get.on.ca.

DEBRIS & LITTER

Illegal dumping is a concern for the Municipality and we are asking for assistance from the community to help keep Township roads and right of ways clean. Anyone witnessing illegal dumping activities should note the licence plate number and report this information to the By-law Enforcement Officer at 519-856-9596 ext. 121 or akreuger@get.on.ca. To notify the Roads Department about debris including dead animals on any part of the municipal right of way (ie. road, curb, shoulder, ditch), please call 519-856-9596 ext. 120 or email lvince@get.on.ca.

ENTRANCE PERMITS

If you are planning to install a primary or secondary entrance or expand your existing entrance, you will require an entrance permit to proceed. If the property is on a Township road, applicants are asked to contact the Roads Department at 519-856-9596 ext. 120 or email lvince@get.on.ca. Please note that work must not commence on the entrance until such time as the entrance permit has been granted by the Township of Guelph/Eramosa.

If the property is located on a County Road, please contact the County of Wellington at 519-837-2600 for County application requirements.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSOVER

A Pedestrian Crossover is a place designated for pedestrians to cross a road. The Pedestrian Crossover in Rockwood is located on Main St. N & Gzowski St. According to section 140 of the Ontario Highway Traffic Act, when a pedestrian is crossing on the roadway within a pedestrian crossover, the driver of a vehicle approaching the crossover (a) shall stop before entering the crossover (b) shall not overtake another vehicle already stopped at the crossover and (c) shall not proceed into the crossover until the pedestrian is no longer on the roadway. SIDEWALK CLEARING

Sidewalk plowing is part of the Township's snow removal service. We work hard to clear sidewalks on our major roads and along routes to school as soon as possible after a snow fall. The remainder of the residential sidewalks are cleared shortly after. Please remember not to block sidewalks with parked vehicles as this does cause an obstruction during winter maintenance.



COUNTY OF WELLINGTON SOLID WASTE SERVICES (SWS)



The County of Wellington is responsible for municipal solid waste management in the Township of Guelph/Eramosa. This includes curbside collection of garbage and recycling. For information on any of our services or facilities, please visit our website www.wellington.ca/sws, see the annual SWS Calendar, or call 519.837.2601.

Curbside Collection

Curbside collection is on Friday. Collection is weekly in towns, villages, and larger subdivisions (urban); every other week in all other areas (rural). Please have materials to the curbside by 7:00 am. Check the SWS calendar or our website for rural collection dates. If you are unsure whether you receive weekly or bi-weekly collection, please call 519.837.2601.

Garbage - User pay garbage bags are needed for garbage collection. There are two sizes - large (\$2.00) and small (\$1.50) which are sold in packages of 10. They are available in many locations, including the Township office. Check the SWS website for a full listing of retailers. If you are experiencing animal issues, garbage cans are an option. Urban residents must obtain a special sticker to use a can. Rural residents can skip this step. Please call the SWS office for more information.

Recycling - Blue boxes are available at the Township office and County waste facilities. There is no charge for the first two; each additional box is \$5.00 (available from waste facilities and the County Administration Centre at 74 Woolwich Street in Guelph). You can put out up to six blue boxes per collection day. See the SWS calendar or the SWS website for acceptable items.

Holidays - Curbside collection is cancelled on statutory holidays. Collection is usually rescheduled to the following Saturday. Changes are advertised in the Wellington Advertiser on the County page. You can also check the SWS calendar or the SWS website.

New subdivisions - The Collections Supervisor regularly monitors new developments. When the majority of construction is completed we can offer collection. A blue box with welcome information will be delivered to each home. Please use one of our waste facilities for your garbage and recycling needs until collection is available.

Diversion Opportunities

There are many diversion opportunities at the County's waste facilities. These operate year-round and include textiles, electronics, tires and hazardous waste materials, which are all accepted for free. Visit our website for site-specific information, directions, and hours.

Composters are available for sale at the Township Office and County waste facilities. They cost \$30 each, taxes included.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) depots are available throughout the County.

Reuse Centres are available at Aberfoyle and Belwood waste facilities. There is also a reuse website to post items for free at www.wellington.reuses.com.

ANNUAL BUDGET

Guelph/Eramosa's annual budget provides the resources to operate all of the Township's departments, which include: fire services, parks and recreation, public works and planning and development, to name a few.

Our operating budget provides the necessary resources to deliver programs, services and facilities to meet the needs of Guelph/Eramosa's growing community. The operating budget is funded primarily through property taxes and user fees.

Our capital budget and forecast is a comprehensive long-term financial plan that identifies the capital requirements of growth and sustaining existing infrastructure. The capital budget is funded through property taxes, Township reserves, development charges, debt and grants. The capital budget is used to build and rehabilitate municipal assets that will last for more than one year.

Reserves and reserve funds receive annual contributions from the operating budget to assist with creating a solid financial position to support the Township's future cash requirements. Maintaining sufficient balances in reserves and reserve funds is a critical component of a municipality's long-term financial plan, as it strengthens its long-term financial sustainability, helps to minimize fluctuations in the tax rate and provides funding to sustain infrastructure.

Final Billing

Final tax bills were mailed the beginning of July and are payable in two installments on the following due dates:

1st Installment - Thursday, August 31st, 2017

2nd Installment - Tuesday, October 31st, 2017

PAYMENT OPTIONS:

Pre-Authorized Payment Plan (PAP)

Monthly – Monthly deductions will be taken out the first Friday of each month with a reconciliation withdrawal in November.

Installment – Installment amounts will be deducted on the tax due dates (February, May, August and October)

Be Better Prepared®!

Power failures can be triggered by many events. Weather such as freezing rain, sleet or high winds can damage power lines & equipment, leaving many without power. Power failures can leave you in the dark for hours or even days. Although power failures can occur in any region, you can learn how to reduce their impact with some planning and preparation.

BEFORE POWER FAILURE HITS:

- Monitor local radio & television stations for severe weather warning
- Keep a battery-powered or, better yet, crank radio on hand
- Keep a flashlight where it can be easily accessed in the dark

PREPARE YOUR 72-HOUR KIT

- Water (2 litres/person/day)
- Non-perishable food items, canned and dried foods (replaced annually)
- Manual can opener
- Flashlight/ batteries or crank flashlight
- Portable radio/batteries or crank radio
- First aid kit
- Extra car keys
- Cash, travelers' cheques and change
- Important personal papers
- Extra seasonal clothing and footwear
- Toiletries
- Analog telephone
- Blankets and sleeping bags
- Medications as well as a list of prescriptions
- Whistle
- Playing cards, travel-sized games, books



- Cell phone fully charged if possible
- Generator – properly installed

Home Generators:

Home generators are handy for backup electricity in case of an outage.

Here are some safety tips to remember:

- Before considering the use of an emergency home generator during power failure, check with furnace, appliance and lighting fixture dealers or manufacturers regarding power requirements and proper operating procedures
- Connecting a generator to an existing electrical system should be done only by a qualified Electrician approved by the Electric Safety Authority (ESA)
- Always ensure that the generator operates outdoors in well-ventilated conditions, away from doors or windows, to prevent exhaust gases from entering the house
- Ensure you have sufficient fuel supply

MARRIAGE LICENCES

Are you getting married in Ontario? The Township of Guelph/Eramosa can issue your marriage licence. The licence must be applied for within three months of the wedding date and is valid anywhere in Ontario. In order to obtain the license, an application form must be completed and signed by both parties, and submitted (by at least one of the applicants) along with the original supporting documents for both parties. Why do you need a building permit?

A building permit is formal permission to begin a construction or demolition project. Building permits are necessary to ensure that construction methods meet the standards set out in the Ontario Building Code, Federal and Provincial regulations, and local by-laws. The Building Department promotes and assists with building development to ensure safe structures for our residents, businesses, and visitors.

WHEN DO YOU NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?

The property owner is responsible for ensuring there is a building permit for the project they are undertaking. A permit is required for:

- The construction, renovation, extension, or demolition of a building or structure (including decks)
- Structural work including alterations to interior partitions, installation of skylights, windows, doors or dormers
- Constructing or finishing rooms in the basement or attic, converting garage space into living space
- Construction or installation of an accessory building larger than 10m² (108 ft²)
- Some designated structures such as retaining walls and solar panels
- New water service, new sewers, alteration or extension of an existing plumbing system
- Any building that contains plumbing or plumbing work including solar heating and lawn irrigation systems
- Raising a dwelling or excavating a crawl space to provide full basement (underpinning of foundation)
- Installation of a new heating system including woodstoves

- The installation, alteration, extension, or repair of on-site sewage systems
- Change of use of a building
- Temporary tents greater than 60m² (645 ft²)
- Installation of a swimming pool

Please note these are general guidelines only. If you are unsure whether your project will require a building permit, please give us a call.

Zoning & Planning

Did you know that construction projects that do not require a building permit are still required to conform to the applicable zoning regulations? Whether the project is large or small, contact the Planning Department at 519.856.9596 ext 112 to determine the zoning and permitted uses for your property. The Township Zoning By-law can be found at www.get.on.ca.

Do you require a permit from the GRCA?

If your proposed construction is within an area regulated by the Grand River Conservation Authority, a GRCA permit will be required in order to proceed with a building permit application. Property owners are encouraged to visit www.grandriver.ca or call at 1.866.900.4722 to determine if GRCA approval is required.

How to Apply for a Building Permit

Application forms and other resources are available at the Municipal Office from Monday-Friday, 8.30am – 4.30pm, and can also be found at www.get.on.ca. If you can't find the information you need, contact 519.856.9596 ext. 114 – we would be happy to assist you. It is always advisable to consult with the building department before submitting an application.

OPEN AIR BURNING PERMITS

Any Open Air Burning requires a permit issued by the Township.

Open Air Burning is defined as the ignition or incineration by fire of combustibles for the purpose of burning grass, clean wood other combustibles in any open place, yard, field or construction area, which is not enclosed by a building or structure and includes fires in barrels and Fire Pits.

Open Air Burning is not permitted in any residential area or rural residential area within the Township unless approved by a permit and is generally only permitted if the property has indicated they meet the setback requirements of 7m from any building, structure, hedge, fence, road, overhead wire, trees or obstruction of any kind.

Rockwood Municipal Wastewater - What Happens After You Flush

We use water daily that goes somewhere after it goes down the drain. But, have you ever wondered what happens to the water you use after you flush your toilet, turn on a faucet, take a shower or wash clothes?

The Rockwood municipal wastewater (sanitary) system consists of service connection pipes (from the private property line to mainline sewer), mainline sewers, manholes, pumping stations/ forcemains and a sewage transfer station.

Rockwood has a total of four sewage lift stations. Three are located south of the Eramosa River and allow for sewage to be pumped from an area of lower elevation into the gravity collection system at a point of higher elevation. The Valley Road Sewage Pumping Station is located on the north side of the Eramosa River and pumps all the sewage generated on the south side of the river and connects into the gravity system on Alma Street.

Sewage flows from the northwest and central areas of Rockwood are not pumped but are gravity fed to the Alma Pre-Treatment Plant.

This newly upgraded pre-treatment plant receives wastewater from all of Rockwood directly by gravity or a combination of pumps and gravity flow. The wastewater flows through the pre-treatment plant where it is de-gritted and aerated. The plant includes odor control before the sewage is pumped approximately 7 kilometers to the City of Guelph.

Rockwood does not have its own sewage treatment facility therefore daily volumes are metered and paid to the City of Guelph through residential user fees.

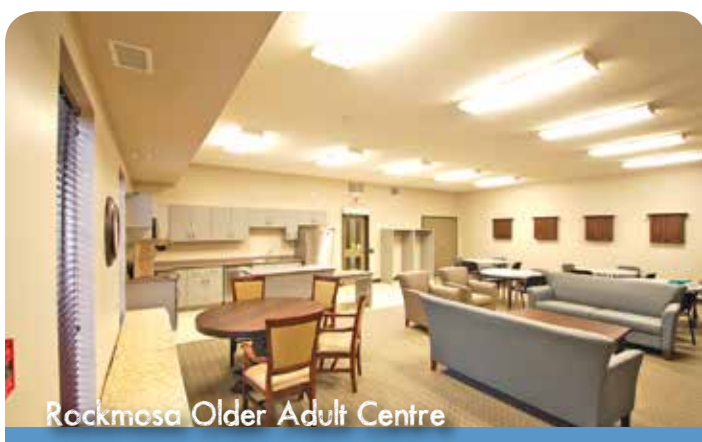

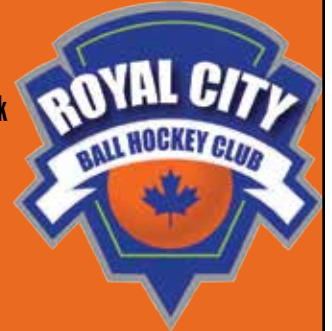

ROCKWOOD HISTORIC WALKING TOUR

Downtown Rockwood

Learn as you walk as history comes alive in the Historic Rockwood Walking Tour. While some exteriors and most interiors have changed many historic buildings still remain in Rockwood with interesting stories to tell!

If these walls could talk, Rockwood's oldest building, built in the late 1820s by original settler Richard Harris, would tell you of its journey from South Rockwood to its current location at 136 Guelph Street. The building at 118 Main Street South's sturdy two feet thick walls would speak of how the land it sits on was surprisingly owned by a woman from 1865 to 1893, so unusual for the time that her husband was listed as owner in the assessment rolls.

Built on the highest point of land, St. John the Evangelist Anglican Church boasts of truly being a church built on a rock as there is no foundation or basement, just solid limestone.

Smelling of history, 104 Main Street South, always tenanted by bakers, still sells the legendary Saunders bread, donuts and "French Ginger" cookies, so tasty even Prime Minister of Canada John Diefenbaker could not resist a visit!

Once housing one of the finest French restaurants, 262 Main Street South lays claim to being a piece of art, portrayed in a painting done in 1926 by A.J. Casson, "Main Street, Rockwood, Ontario," of the Group of Seven.

The original Town Hall at 191 Main Street South reflects the commitment and dedication of a determined Community. Originally built in 1870 this building was the locale for community activities. Falling into a state of disrepair in the 1980s a citizens group undertook a restoration project. Pitching in they raised funds, studied plans, and finally, brought their hammers, saws and nails and went to work.

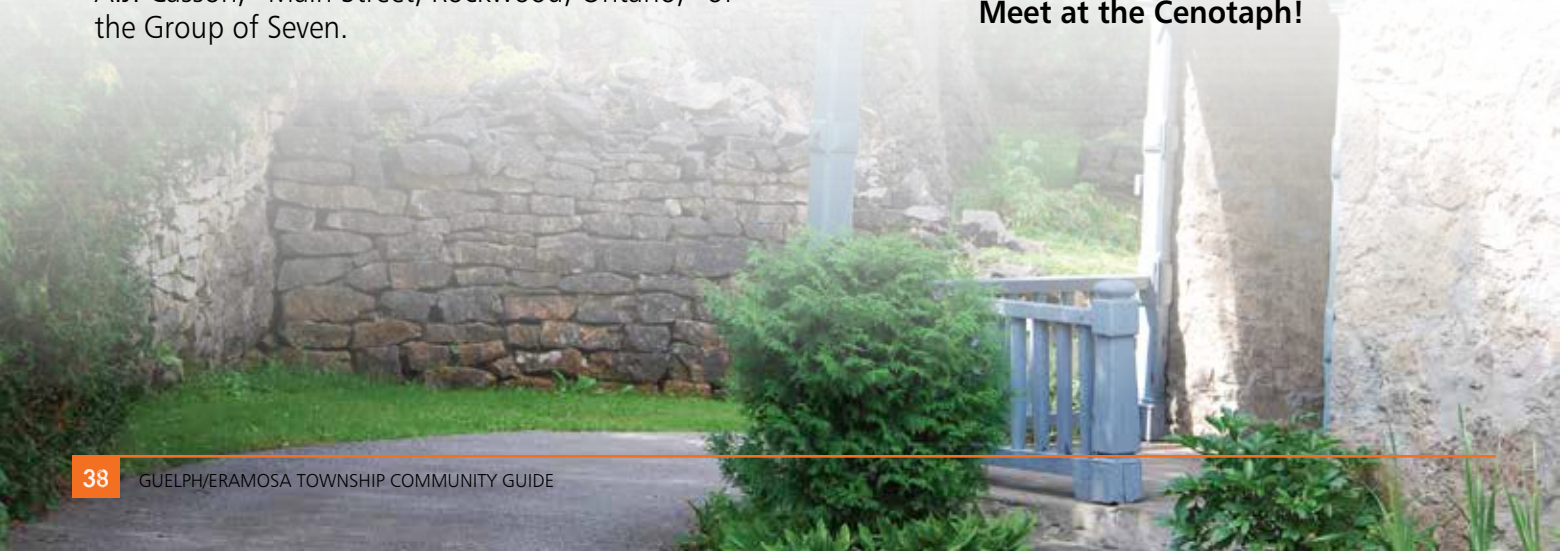
Also owing its gratitude to a dedicated restoration is the Rockwood Academy at 477 Main Street South. This magnificent old structure was built in 1850 as a school for boys. In keeping with the religious inclination of the Quakers, the Academy provided a simple but strict and thorough education.

These are only a few of the historical sites in Rockwood. Join us on a guided tour to learn more, including what building may house a ghost or two, who claimed to be married to King Edward VIII, what influence the Quakers had on the Village, where the best refuge was for "sober travellers" and what church was built for \$950.00.

Then and Now

Hortop Mill / Everton Mill

242 Evert Street, Everton Guelph-Eramosa
Eramosa Township, Concession 7, Lot 11

In October 1821, Charles Everts, who came to Canada as an U.E. Loyalist after being dispossessed from his property in Pennsylvania, was given land in Eramosa from the Crown to recompense him for his loyalty. He deeded part of his land along the banks of the Speed River to his wife, Irena Everts. Around 1859, her son Rufus

Everts, having earlier acquired the property from his father, erected a wooden frame for a flour mill along the Eramosa branch banks of the Speed River. Prior to the erection of this new mill, Rufus and his father had erected another mill directly across on the opposite bank of the river. The wooden structure stood unfinished until William and Simon Plewes, expert millers, agreed to complete the mill and install the necessary machinery in return for the use of the mill for a number of years.

The mill was owned by Rufus until 1874 when it was sold to Henry Hortop Jr. of Eden Mills. The Hortop family kept the mill running for three generations. The mill produced flour and grist, and there was also a sawmill on the property. They were best known for their flour, Lilly White Flour, which was packaged in 24, 71, and 100 pound bags. They sold flour to local bakeries as well as Toronto based bakeries; Weston and Christie. The Hortop family owned the mill until 1966, when it was purchased by the Grand River Conservation Authority at which time operation of the mill ceased. The mill sat dormant for a number of years and the building began to deteriorate. The Grand River Conservation Authority had plans to tear the mill down, but the local community petitioned to save it as it was a piece of local history. Around 1975 the Wellington County Historical Research Society

and Eramosa Township signed a five year lease with the Grand River Conservation Authority to restore the building. The funds came from the Provincial Government, Eramosa Township, and the Grand River Conservation Authority. When the restoration was completed, a dedication service was held on September 19, 1976, and the building was signed with a historic plaque. When the five year agreement expired, the lease was not renewed and unfortunately the mill sat vacant until 2017 when it was completely destroyed by a fire on January 19.

The Stone Farmhouse

"This stone farmhouse is an excellent representation of the many stone homes scattered throughout the Township. The construction of the residence exemplifies a high degree of sophistication and reflects the expertise of the Scottish masons. Built by Robert Blyth in 1888, the building is well preserved and retains its original form".

Ariss Post Office

Joseph House built this frame building as a home in 1902 with a general store in one room. In 1908 the Post Office was established there with the arrival of the CPR railway, Mrs. Ellen House acting as Post Mistress. Rural Route #1, Ariss, established in 1911, was the first rural line to operate in Guelph Township. Gas pumps were added in 1918. In 1960 the building expanded to its present size to accommodate the Lucky Dollar grocery chain. In 2008, Ariss Post Office was honoured for 100 years of service".

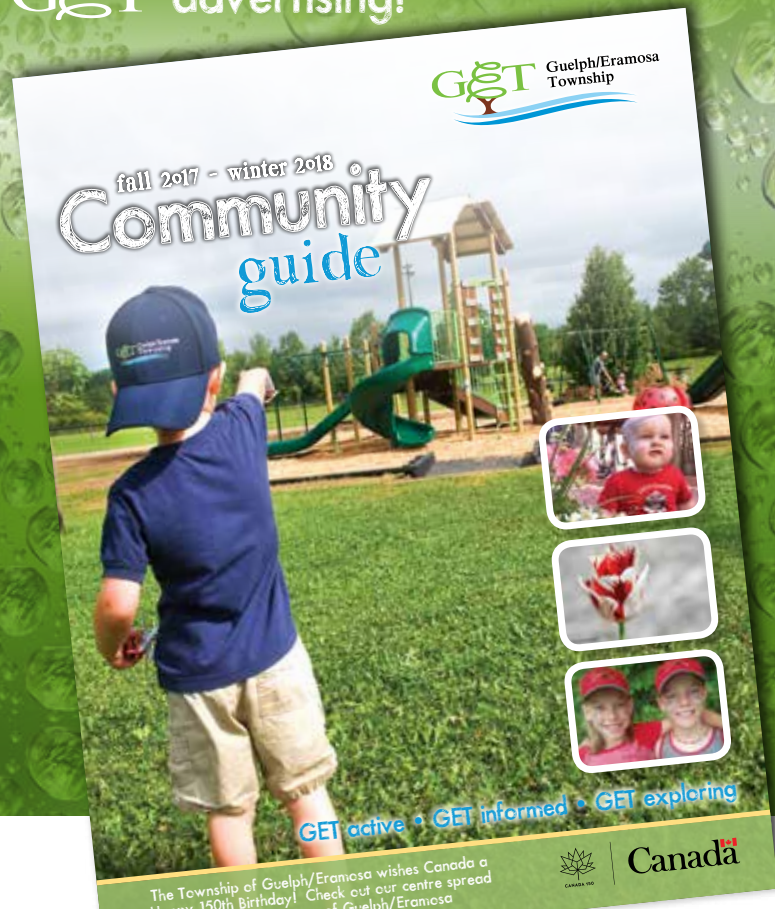
