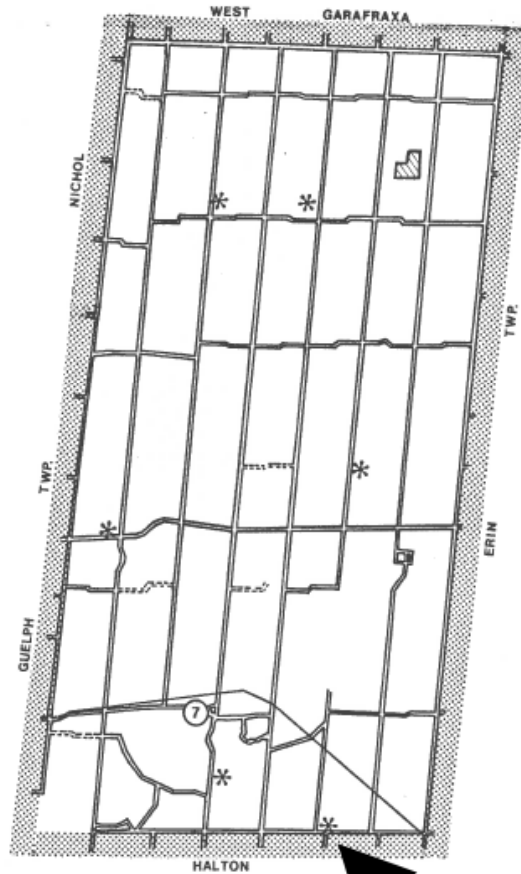

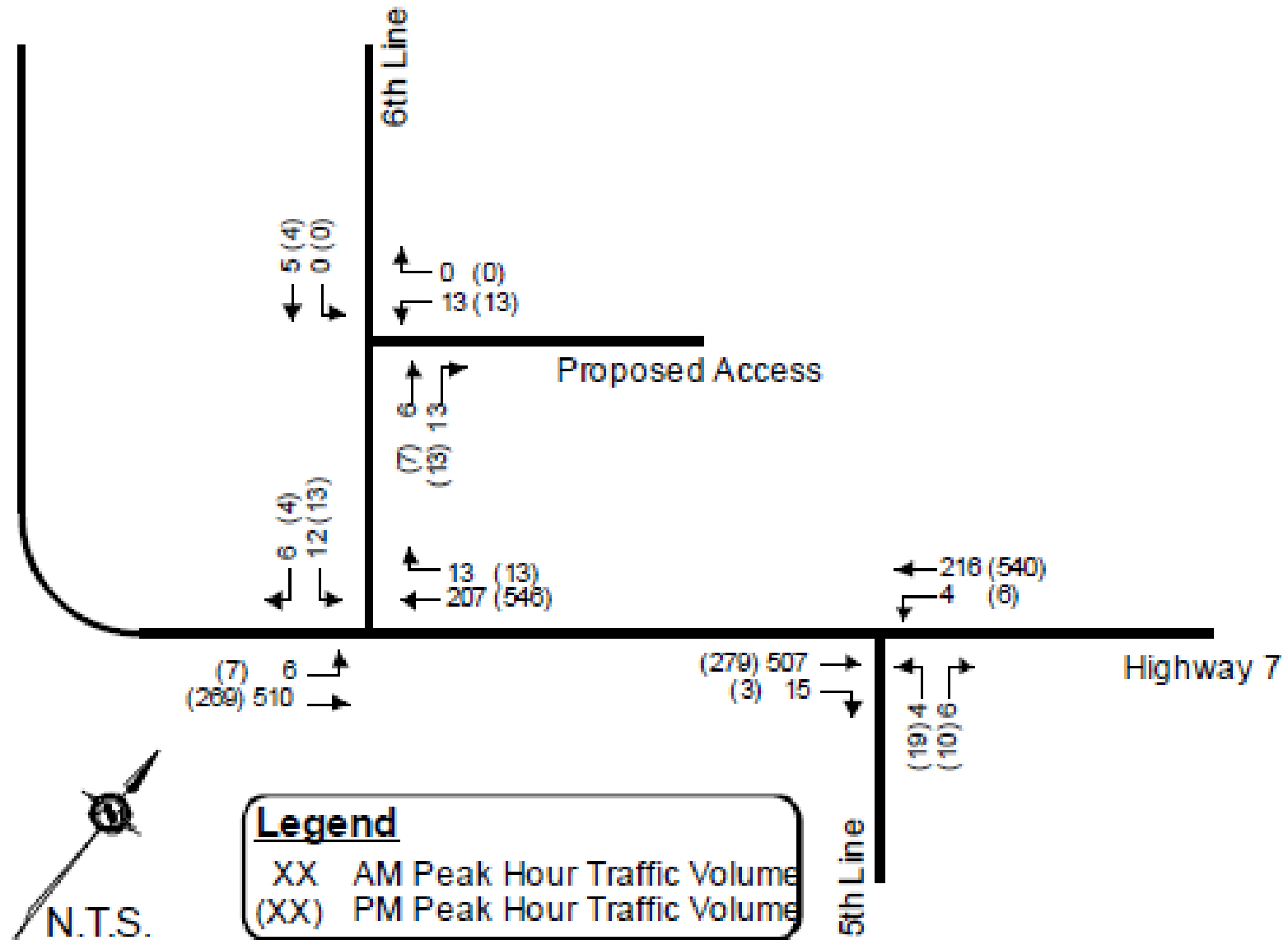
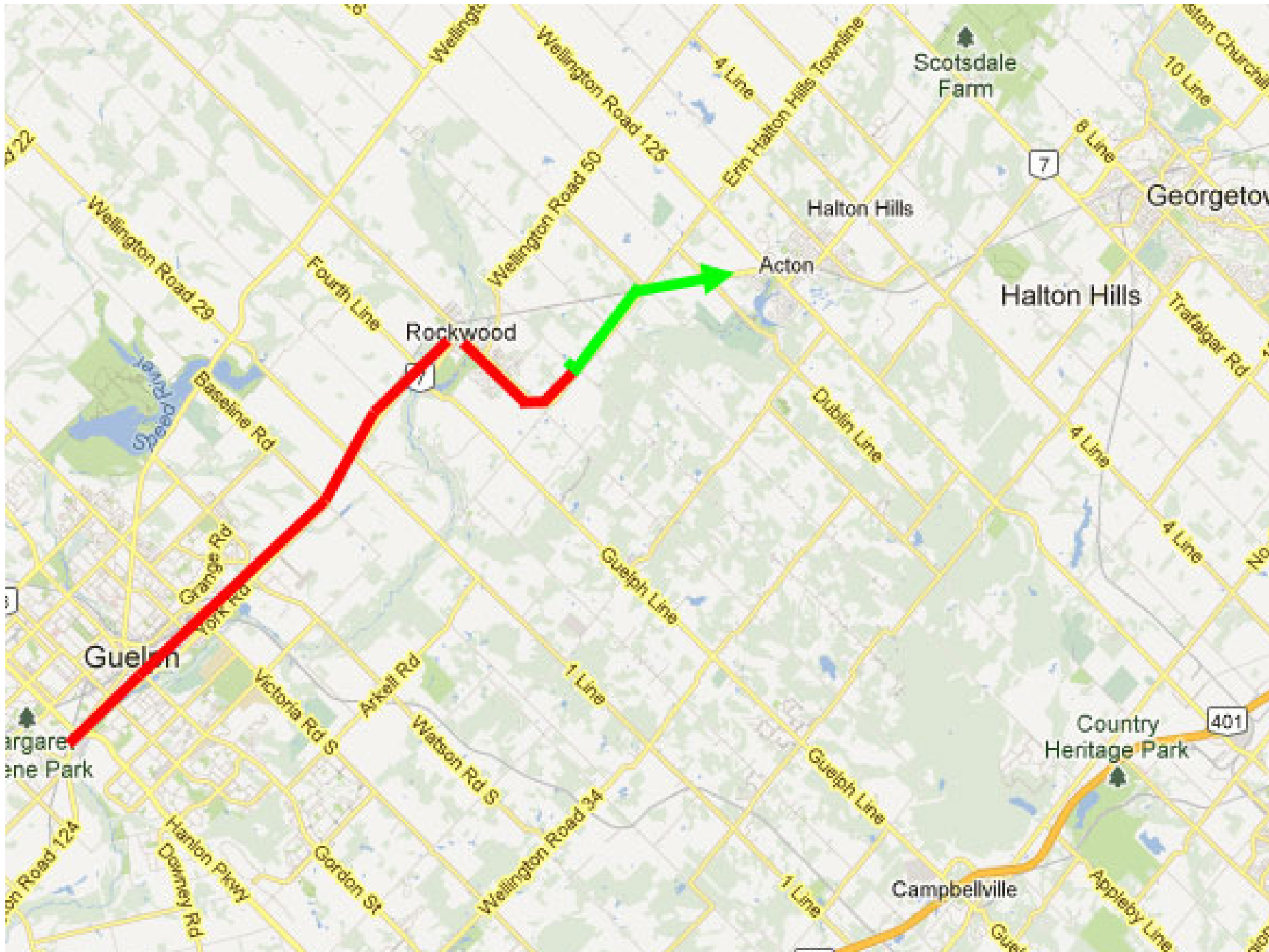


Figure 4-4 Existing Plus Site-Related Traffic Volumes

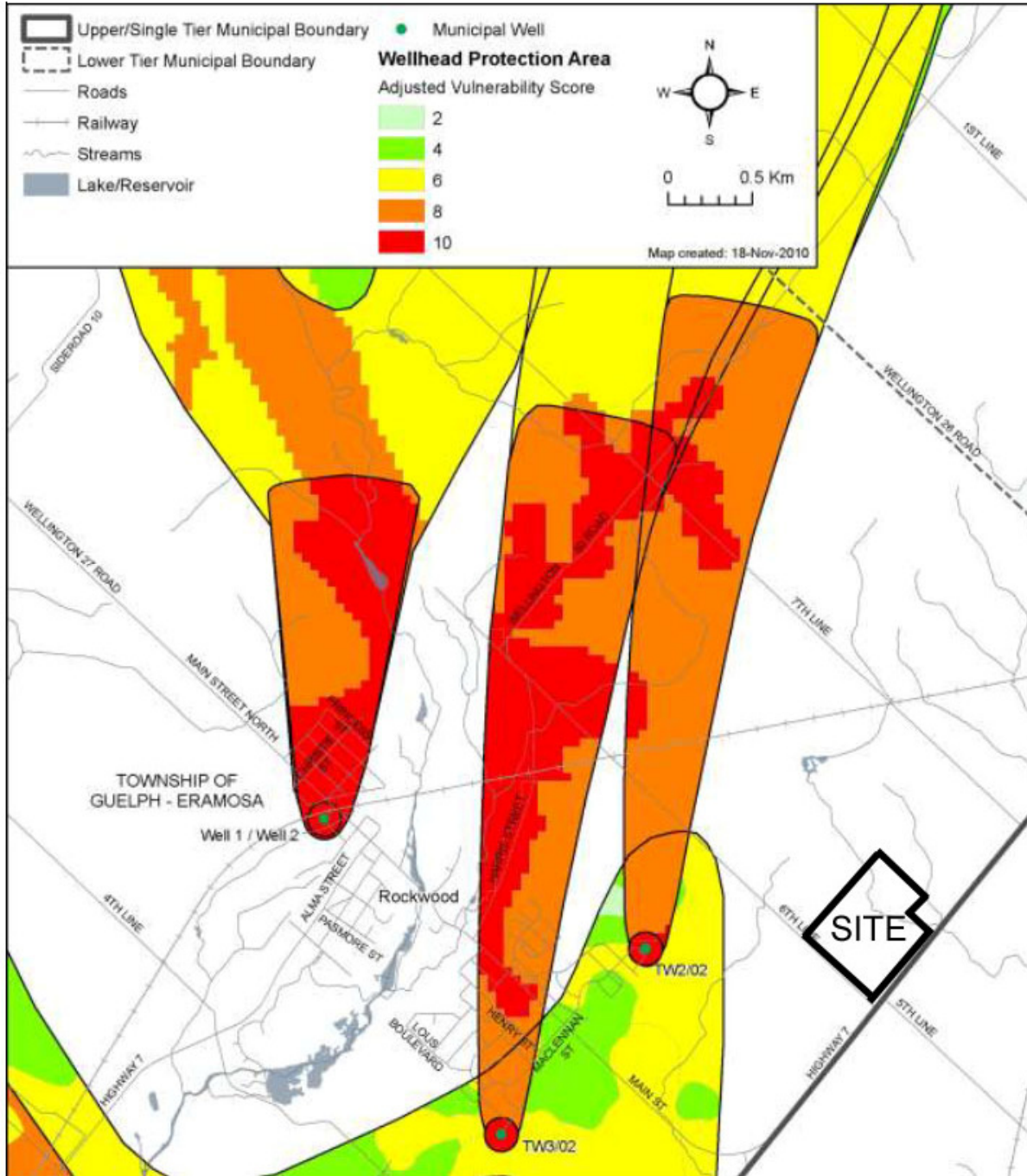

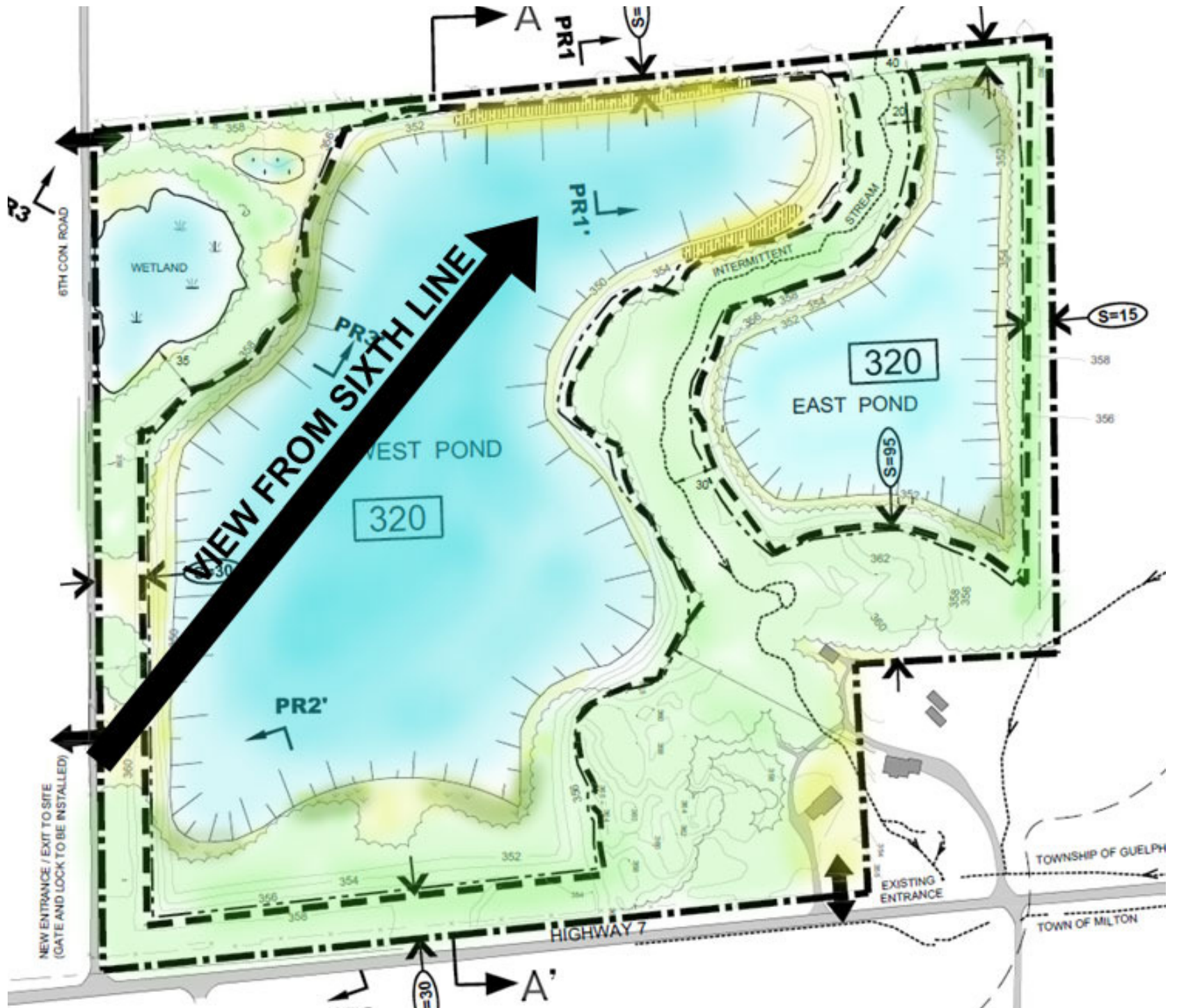

Map 7-49: Rockwood Water Supply Wellhead Protection Area Final Vulnerability



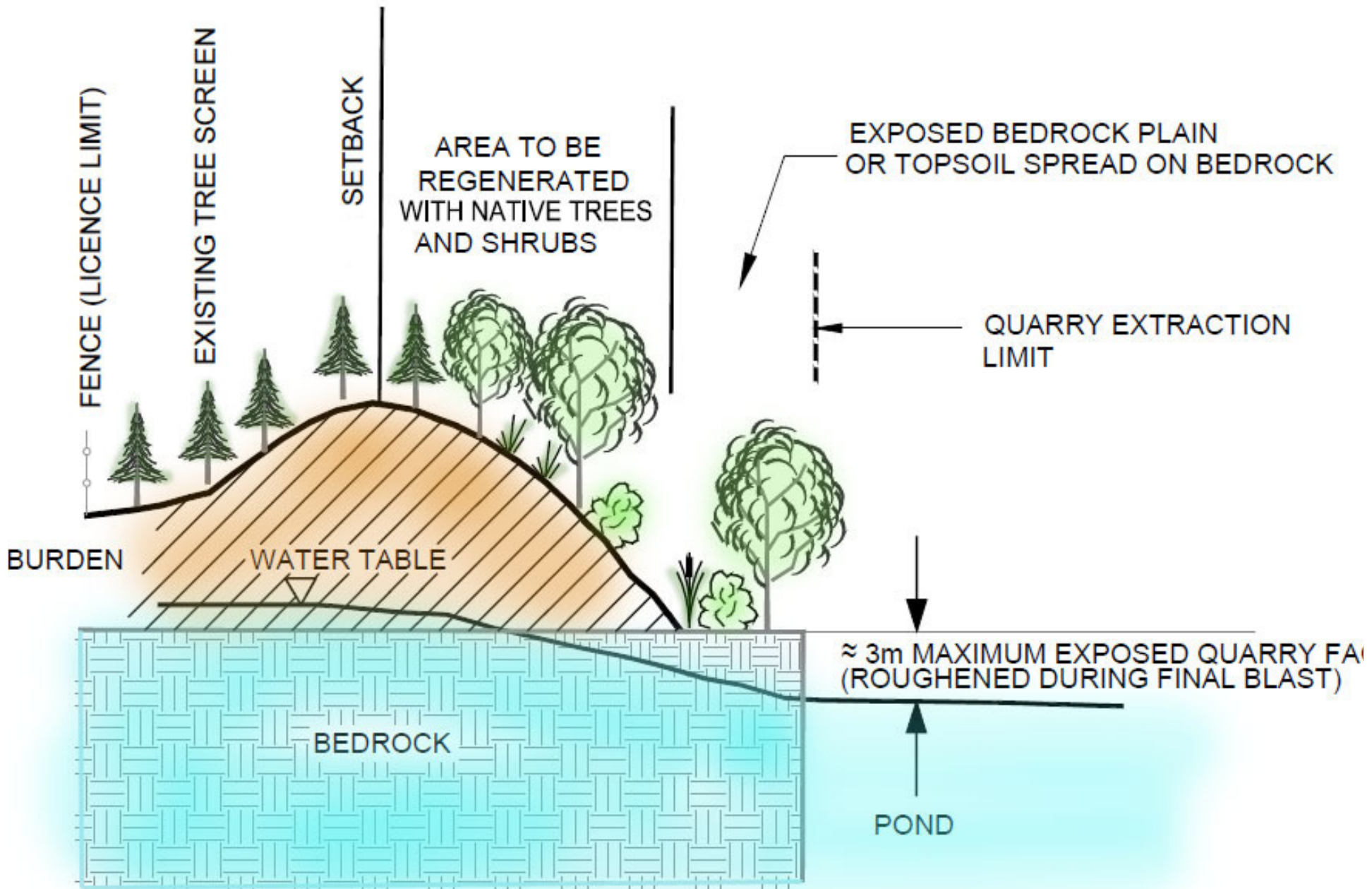
