 3. Has any of this person's children received, or are any now receiving, elementary or secondary school instruction in Canada in French? (does not include French immersion or French as a second language)

(Note: as required by provincial legislation, school support is automatically defaulted to English-Public until the owner or tenant instructs otherwise.)
