Royal Distributing Athletic Performance Centre COVID-19 Vaccine Certificate Protocol

Guelph Eramosa Township is committed to ensuring the health and safety of all participants, visitors and staff at the Royal Distributing Athletic Performance Centre(RDAPC). This document outlines the process for collecting vaccine certificates for members of the public participating at or visiting the RDAPC

Starting September 22, 2021, Ontarians will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days) and provide their proof of vaccination along with photo ID to access certain public settings and facilities which includes facilities used for sports and fitness activities and personal training including recreational facilities.

Children under 12 years of age are not required to be vaccinated. However, the parent or caregiver accompanying the child will be required to show their vaccine certificate.

Staring September 22, 2021 Who is required to show a Vaccine Certificate?

- Individuals 12 years of age and older, participating in the following types of Guelph Eramosa Township programming:
 - Registered recreation programs i.e. Active 55 Fitness, DDPY
 - Drop-in recreation and fitness programs i.e. Fitness classes, Tot N ' Play, Walking Soccer
 - Parents participating in parent/child lessons or spectating their child's program/lessons
 - Group Field and Track rentals made by individuals
 - Track users
 - Spectators
- Participants of sport clubs, adult sport leagues
 - Participants/Club Staff will be required to follow the protocols put forth by their governing sport bodies

Exemptions will apply only to those identified in the Exemptions (page 4/5) section of the proof of vaccination guidance for business. Guidance to Reopening Ontario

Process and Steps for Collecting Vaccine Certificates

 All Participants in Guelph Eramosa Township registered recreation programs, track members, and drop-in participants, and facility renters will be required to show their vaccine certification to staff each time they enter the facility

- All participants and visitors to the RDAPC will still be required to complete a COVID screening prior to arrival or upon arrival. Participants that are members of a sport club/league will complete their club screening.
- Participants and visitors will still be required to wear masks/face coverings in general public areas. Masks are not required while participating in an activity once the class or activity has begun. Masks must be put on immediately after completion of the class or activity.
- Unvaccinated people with verified medical exemptions will be permitted. Proof of medical exemption will be required. <u>Medical Exemption Qualifications</u>.

Single Use Exemptions

- to use a washroomto make a retail purchase
- while paying for an order
- as may be necessary for the purposes of health and safety
